2. Project identity book

This document is the project identity manual of the **GreenHeritage project** which contains all the guidelines about its image. It brings together the visual and communicative elements that characterise the project, managing its internal and external use.

This manual gathers the basic tools for the correct use and graphic application of the **GreenHeritage** brand in all its possible expressions. It has been designed with the needs of all those responsible for interpreting, articulating, communicating and applying the brand in its different areas.

The correct and consistent use of the **GreenHeritage** brand will help the project to achieve the objectives of identification and reinforcement of the brand.

In this section aspects of interest of the project identity book and its elements such as leaflets or newsletter template are described. The most important material of this deliverable is present in the annexes, where the project identity book, the leaflets, or the different templates to be used during the project, are shown.

As previously mentioned, this document is closely related to the *GreenHeritage Dissemination Plan* (GreenHeritage deliverable D5.1)

In the following, the different items constituting the project identity book of GreenHeritage project are described.

2.1 Development of the project identity book (Annex I)

This item refers properly to the **GreenHeritage** project identity book. The document brings together the basic tools for the correct use and graphic application of the project.

Firstly, the graphic development of the logo is shown. From a conceptual point of view, the logo shows in the clearest possible graphic form the object of the project, summarised in our claim: **the impact of climate change on intangible cultural heritage**, the ultimate goal of the project being to implement activities/actions to protect intangible cultural heritage from the effects of CC. The logo is composed of the abstraction of four leaves that form the image of a flower or a four-leaf clover, each of them safeguarding a graphic linked to different manifestations of **intangible cultural heritage (ICH)**, declared by **UNESCO**, such as living expressions inherited from our ancestors (mask), oral traditions (voice symbol), knowledge (book and light bulb) and social uses (community). Of course, *intangible cultural heritage* encompasses more practices and expressions, but we believe that these symbols broadly reflect all of them. In the centre, serving as the axis of the logo, is the title of the project. A circle surrounds all the graphics, again emphasizing the protective aspect of the project. The colors used are blue and various shades of green, usually related to intangible cultural heritage (blue), nature and its sustainable and safeguarding variant (green).

The document includes the pantones used in the logo, which are essential when creating a graphic design based on the original model.



With regard to the official typeface for the written documents of the project, **Arial** with its variants was chosen. The reason for its selection is simple: it is a nice font that is practically set as standard on all computers. One of the usual problems in project identity books is to choose very specific typefaces that cause users to not access it or to have problems installing it, so it is highly recommended to use a universal typeface such as **Arial**.

Then, the identity book develops the coexistence of the official project logo with the logo of the **European Union**, as co-founder of the GreenHeritage project, within the **Erasmus+ programme**. In all graphic public documents, the logo of the European Union, as co-founder of the project must appear. More information on this aspect can be found in the *dissemination plan* of the GreenHeritage project, (GreenHeritage deliverable D5.1). It will be done in agreement to the indications reported in the Art. 17.2 of the GreenHeritage Grant Agreement (GA)

In the following of the present document is shown the design of the different templates, leaflets, or roll-ups of the project. Each of them with their uses and peculiarities are described in the following sub-sections.

2.2 Leaflets (Annexes II - VI)

An important tool for the dissemination is the leaflet, which should convey in a few words the fundamental aspects of the project. In the case of GreenHeritage project, the development of digital leaflets was adopted. A simple model that can also be printed on paper without any problem, was selected. The project foresees the production of the leaflet in English and then its translation into four other national languages of the different project partners (Italian, Spanish, Greek and Latvian). It was chosen to make a generic leaflet in English. In addition, it has been decided that the brochures in the different languages will also keep the original English text; the successful experience of this format in other European projects has led to select this option.

The following parts appear in the leaflet and create its content:

- *The partners involved in the project with the inclusion of their logo and their website.*
- *A concise description of the project.*
- *The budget and duration of the project and the European Union program to which it belongs, indicating its co-financing.*
- *The actions and expected results.*
- *Website of the project and contact e-mail.*

The photographs/images used in the leaflet include practices declared as **Intangible Cultural Heritage**. This criterion was extended to all the photographic images that appear in this project identity book. Generic photos that may be valid in most of the countries members of the consortium have been used, together with images of



demonstrations that are common to several partner countries, such as dry stonework or falconry.

In **Annexes II, III, IV, V and VI** appear the pdf version images of the leaflet in English as well as in Italian, Spanish, Greek and Latvian.

2.3 Press release (Annex VII)

This is the template in **docx** format (*Microsoft Word*) to be used in press releases or other types of project information documents. It includes the logo and the project website. Each press release must include the contact details of the person responsible for further information. The person responsible for expanding the information will be the project coordinator. The contact email is: pad@milib.cnr.it

2.4 Newsletter template model (Annexes VIII - X)

One of the fundamental elements for the dissemination of the project is the sending of informative electronic newsletters. One of the requirements of the project is to send two newsletters per year. In this case, several annexes have been designed. One of them is a model in **HTML** format so that it can be recognized by generic platforms for mass emailing delivery platforms such as *gmail*, *wordpress* or *mailchimp*. Given that sometimes these templates can cause problems (due to the use of platforms not compatible or with configuration problems), in addition to the template in HTML format, a newsletter template sample in **pdf** is presented, together with the main image that shapes the template, in a separate annex. The aim is to overcome problems deriving from the use of different platforms. Most of mass mailing programs have the option of configuring a base template in a simple and intuitive way. This is also the reason why an excessively complex newsletter template was not designed.

2.5 Slides for presentation (Annexes XI – XII)

One of the most widely used tools for the dissemination of any project are the presentations, mainly from the *Microsoft Power Point* program or similar. The chosen format is **16:9**, practically most of the current presentations are made in this format, which is the usual one on computers and screens, and we have discarded the idea of also adjusting them to **4:3**. For this manual, we have designed three slides.

- The first serves as the cover of the presentation. The logo of the project, the European Union and partners appears in a fixed way. Secondly, some editable text boxes allow to include the necessary information.
- The second slide aims to provide information but in a more graphic way, that is, the image is more important than the text. It is a slide in which the green colour predominates, and only a fixed white graphic with the GreenHeritage logo appears. A model for the use of photographs and a text box have been designed, but both are perfectly modifiable according to the user's needs.



- The third slide is a more classic one, designed to highlight the written information. A blank slide only has the GreenHeritage logo as fixed elements together with the European Union logo, and a small graphic in the lower right part. As in the previous case, a proposal for the use of text boxes and images that are perfectly modifiable according to the needs of the users has been designed.

In the annexes, there is a presentation model in **PDF** format, but, above all, in **PPT** (*Microsoft Power Point*) format which is fully editable.

2.6 Roll up (Annex XIII)

It was considered **essential** to create a roll up of the project. One of the fundamental pillars of European projects is to have a strong commitment on **dissemination**. For GreenHeritage project this aspect is very important, considering that a fundamental part of it is the implementation of courses or policy roundtables. It is essential that all these meetings are presided over by a roll up, and that in the material/images that will be distributed to the media or uploaded to our networks, a clear reference to GreenHeritage project is present, as the project logo and website. All these elements certify that a GreenHeritage event is taking place.

The design of a simple roll up is proposed where the reference to the project, the **European Union** and the consortium partners appears clearly visible. The reference to the GreenHeritage website must also be clearly visible.

The selected photograph is a reference to the knowledge and techniques of the art of building **dry stonewalls**, declared ICH in 2018 and common to several of the countries of the consortium.

2.7 Logo (Annex XIV)

This section is mainly linked to **Annex XIV**, which includes the official logo of the GreenHeritage project in different formats (**JPEG, PNG, AI** and **EPS**) so that all partners can use them, according to the needs.

2.8 Declaration of release

Based on other ERASMUS+ projects experiences, too, the following sentence will be included in the project website and Newsletters, but not in the deliverables, based on the consideration that the contents of deliverables are public only after the approval by EC.

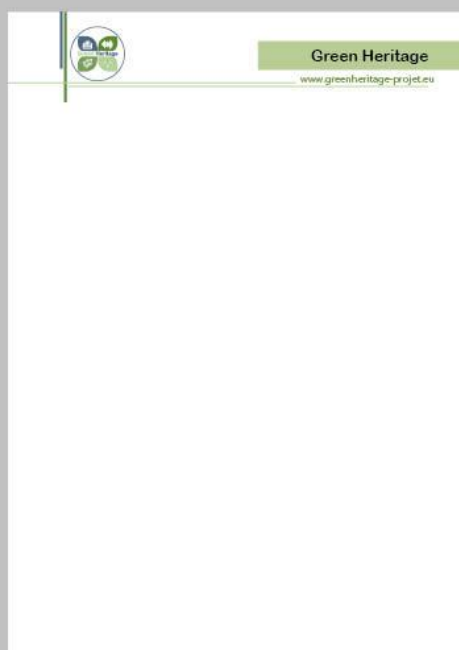

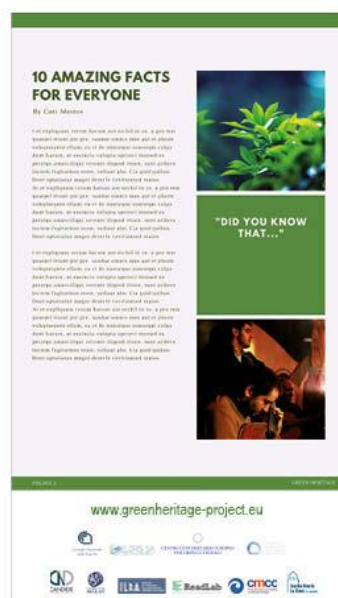
